

Anti-Trust Statement

Because of federal and New Jersey anti-trust laws certain topics are not proper subjects for discussion at any NJSOP functions. In many cases, our members are competitors and any action or agreement which may eliminate, restrict or govern competition among members or their colleagues could be a violation of anti-trust laws. Those violating the anti-trust laws are subject to severe criminal and civil penalties.

This means that we must not discuss any items falling within the realm of competitive practices, such as current prices or future prices or charges; discounts for cash payments; terms of service; productivity rates; profit levels; credit terms; or refusal to deal with a particular third party payor or medical device/equipment vendor.

Please adhere strictly to these guidelines during all NJSOP functions to protect yourself and your business from liability.
